EDUCATION



The EDUCATION Award honours those who have helped shape and have made a significant contribution to the world of regulatory education and training.

The winners this year were

Detlef Hold, Nathalie Schultze and Elke
Sims of the Roche Global Regulatory
Pipeline Programme. Accepting the
Award on their behalf was Steve Slater,
Senior Global Regulatory Leader at
Roche.

The programme is an innovative way to accelerate and enhance the readiness of future global regulatory leaders and increase their level of competency. It aims to identify candidates through targeted, individualised, accelerated and intensive learning.

SUPPORT



The SUPPORT category recognises the crucial role that those in the support sector play in the effectiveness of the regulatory process, and the importance of the quality of the work they do.

The Award was presented to Valérie Codrons and the Quintiles RA Team, based in Belgium. The team provided high-quality regulatory science, strategy and operational support for a very challenging indication area (which is a significant public health problem globally).

Their integrated support – working closely with the sponsor – has resulted in a pioneering approval. They demonstrated great teamwork and a creative regulatory approach.

CONTRIBUTION



The penultimate Award of the evening was CONTRIBUTION, rewarding experienced regulatory professionals who do an excellent job to provide the very best in regulatory professionalism.

The Award was given to **Angela Stokes** from Chiltern International.
Angela is a highly-motivated regulatory professional with a strong scientific background in chemistry, pharmacology and toxicology.

She has more than 20 years of experience, gained both in contract research organisations and pharmaceutical companies. She is an excellent communicator at all levels and influential in regulatory affairs training and mentoring.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT



This special Award celebrates the career of an individual who has committed themselves to furthering the cause of regulatory affairs, drug development and regulatory science.

The Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to **Dr June Raine**, who has strengthened public health protection for the benefit of all citizens in the European Union and beyond.

Having trained in general medicine at Oxford University, her interest in drug safety paved her way to a lifelong career in medicines regulation spanning several critical and pivotal roles in assessment, management and strategic development within the UK national authority and European regulatory network.

As part of an EU collaboration June was instrumental in ensuring all EU citizens had wider access to medicines through co-chairing the EU Commission's project on 'Promoting good governance for non-prescription drugs.' She designed and led the first Better Regulation initiative in UK medicines regulation, subsequently endorsed by the European Commission.

June is a member of a senior management team which has transformed the MHRA into an international success, based on a strategic model that has since been adopted by regulatory authorities worldwide. She has made outstanding contributions towards the delivery of the world-class European Union pharmacovigilance system that we see today.

Her application of her cross-disciplinary knowledge and experience in medicine, pharmacy, regulation of medicines and public health protection through pharmacovigilance and risk-management of medicines has truly shaped the practice of regulatory affairs.
